Question for Reflection

Most of us strive to demonstrate trustworthy character in our lives, often not understanding trustworthy character as a fruit of our relationship with God.

Reflect on 1 Samuel 3:19–20 ("As Samuel grew up, the LORD was with him and let none of his words fall to the ground.

And all Israel from Dan to Beer-sheba knew that Samuel was a trustworthy prophet of the LORD"). How does this challenge our understanding of what makes us trustworthy?
