Questions for Reflection based on Psalm 27

Verse 4:

How can you prioritize seeking God's face above all else during this Lenten season?

Verse 14:

What does it mean to "wait for the Lord" and how can you practice patience during times of waiting?

Question for Reflection

In Luke 13:35 Jesus says, "And I tell you, you will not see me until the time comes when you say, 'Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord.'"

To what sort of "seeing" does Jesus refer? Is Jesus calling for more than a verbal declaration that he is the Messiah? How might I live so that I become a testimony that Jesus is truly the one who comes in the name of God?
